Exhibits will not be held after that date and will be discarded. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE RELEASED DURING FAIR WEEK.**

**GATE ADMISSION:** MontanaFair will provide one free day gate admission pass to individual exhibitors who enter FIVE or MORE ENTRIES in any one department. Exhibitors may purchase MontanaFair season passes for \$18.00 or one day gate admission passes for \$4.00 (1/2 regular gate admission) at the Entry Office in the Expo Center at MontanaFair.

**ELIGIBILITY:** Open to all Montana youth (preschool through 2009 high school graduate). Enter class for age of child when project was completed.

**PREMIUMS:** All prize money will be paid to the individual exhibitor at the following rates:

1st place - \$4.00, 2nd place \$3.00, 3rd place \$2.00

Best of show ribbons will also be awarded in each age group.

People's Choice Awards of \$25.00, donated by Western Security Bank in Lockwood and Western Center in the Heights, will also be awarded to one entry in each age group which will be voted on by people throughout MontanaFair.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS:** Please read these rules carefully because they will be adhered to explicitly.

1. Exhibits must have been made during the past year.
2. The word ENTRY denotes articles entered for sweepstakes and Best in Show.
3. Only one entry per class per exhibitor will be accepted.
4. All exhibits must be original. No kits, dittoed project of patterns please. Exceptions given to preschool through kindergarten age children.
5. The Superintendent is instructed to refuse any exhibit that lacks educational or artistic value.
6. Large-sized entries will be displayed according to space available (maximum 2' x 4').
7. No responsibility is assumed by MontanaFair in the loss, damage or breakage of an exhibit in route to or from the fair, or while on the fairgrounds. However, all due care and caution will be exercised to prevent such loss or damage.

**HOW TO PREPARE ENTRIES - A STEP-BY-STEP CHECKLIST:**

1. Gather materials: Youth Art Exhibitor's Handbook, entry forms and back tags. (One form per exhibitor)
2. Prepare entry forms: Fill in the top section of the entry form. Please include your telephone number in case there are questions on your entry form.
3. Find division and class numbers: Enter only one piece of art for each division number. Many pieces can be entered in more than one category, pick the best one for your piece of art.
4. Submit entry forms: Enter online at [www.montanafair.com](http://www.montanafair.com) or mail entry forms mail them to MontanaFair, PO Box 2514,

Billings, MT 59103.

5. Mount artwork: Make sure to mount artwork on tag, poster board, or other material with a 1 inch border suitable for stapling to the wall. Heavy, thick mounting needs a hanger attached as it will not hold a staple. Provide mounting for matted pictures, as they are hung with staples.
6. Prepare back tags: Be sure to put back tags on the lower left corner of your artwork. Example of back tag:

7. Attach the entry tag: Staple your entry tag to the top right hand corner of your artwork with the hole of the entry tag accessible for tying on ribbons.

#### **DEFINITIONS FOR DETERMINING DIVISION ENTRY AND JUDGING OF ENTRIES:**

Cartooning: Original characterizations in panel form comic strip or single cartoon (political, etc.)

Ceramics: Any form made by the student's hand from ceramic clay. No commercial mold products.

Collage: Making a composition that is built up wholly or partly from pieces of paper, cloth, or other materials.

Commercial: Artwork depicting commercial art items, (Examples: Pepsi can, Coke ad, etc.)

Crayon: Notching, blending (mixing), drawing, etching, transferring encaustic, stenciling, batik, etc.

Creative: Must be student's interpretation of any idea by organization and presentation.

Design in Repetition: Repeating designs to create a pleasing composition.

Diorama: 3-D presentation in a box. May partially incorporate commercial items.

Finger painting: Any paint applied by hand.

Handwriting: One page of handwriting. Margin on left & right. One entry per lot number. Must be mounted. No cover or booklets.

Hanging Project: Artwork that is designed to be suspended with more than one side visible: mobiles, banners, etc. Do not attach hanging to mounting.

Kit Projects: Project made with commercial kits (model cars, stained glass, rug hooking, paint by number, etc.)

Lettering: Letters, words, phrases, sentences, etc. done freehand, in an artistic fashion. Handwriting not accepted.

Map/Chart/Graph/Diagram: A graphic representation. May contain other related material. No illustrated books with narration.

Media: Refers to any materials used for expression. (Examples: clay, colored pencil).

Method: Refers to the process used for expression (Examples: painting, scratch board).

Mixed Media: Refers to the use of two or more media for expression in the visual art.

Other Media: Any media NOT included in classes. Please list on the entry tag what "other media" is used. (Examples: clay, colored pencil).

Other Method: Any method, style, or kind of method NOT included in other classes. Please list on the entry tags what "other method" is used, (examples: mosaic, scratch board, pointillism).

Patterns/Tracing/Dittoes: No pre-made commercial patterns, dittoes, or tracing from pictures, comic strips, etc. No teacher stencils, drawn cut figures or stencils. (Exception: Preschool, Kindergarten, Grade 1, commercial maps, diagrams, etc.).

Poster: Must deliver a message using text. May also include illustration.

Printing: Impressions left on surfaces by sponge, cardboard, etc. or objects from nature (wood, leaves) manufactured items, original stencils, linoleum cuts, woodcuts, lithographs.

Recycled Objects: Making a composition or assemblage that is built up wholly from recycled everyday objects or materials.

Rubbings: Rubbings are made by placing paper (or cloth) against a textured surface and rubbing crayon/chalk over the paper transferring the textures to the paper.

Scratch Board: Original work scratched through at least two layers.

Sculpture – Full Round: Three dimensional forms that are added to, subtracted from or hand spaced in any way from materials selected by the student.

Sculpture – Relief: Must be attached to its background: friezes, bas relief.

Tempera – Opaque: (non-transparent) water based paint.

Three Dimensional Object: Refers to free standing or hanging format so that it may be viewed from more than one side(dioramas included).

Three Dimensional Picture: Refers to a relief format one flat side with some part raised from the surface.

Water Color: Transparent water based paint applied with a brush.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

1. Artist must have been enrolled in a school in Montana during 2008-2009 school year.
2. Artist will be between ages 14 through 17 or a 2009 high school graduate.
3. Three selections in different media will be submitted as one portfolio. One of the three selections must use color.
4. Exhibitors may enter two portfolios, but all six pieces must be of different medias.
5. Entries will be within RRR Divisions 1 through 34 as contained in this Youth Art Exhibitor's Handbook or the on MontanaFair website, [www.montanafair.com](http://www.montanafair.com).
6. Entries must have been created during the past year.
7. Flatwork must be suitably framed or conventionally mounted and ready to be displayed on wall. Use strong hangers and supports on the back. No masking tape, no scotch tape. Framing/mounting is considered part of the judging criteria and is essential for a complete exhibit presentation.
8. Scholarship portfolios will not be eligible for competition in the open division for youth. However, scholarship exhibitors may enter other exhibits in open division.
9. Scholarship winners will be announced on Saturday, August 8, 2009.
